End of an Era


After 11 years working as part of our Bidbury team, Mrs Diprose will be leaving us on Friday 20th October to begin her new role within the insurance industry.

Treasure Island is our new nurture room run by Mrs Bruce, Mrs Fry and Miss Hallitt.

The aim of this provision is to address social and emotional needs that can be a barrier to children's learning. It is designed to help children develop vital social skills, to develop confidence and self-respect, and to take pride in behaving well and achieving. There is a special emphasis on language development and communication: nothing is taken for granted and everything is clearly explained by the team. Children are given the time they need both to listen and be listened to.

Year R—Curriculum focus

Milestone 1:

Celebrating Learning at Bidbury

Year 1—Autumn 1

English

We will be reading 'The Perfect Fit' and using this as a stimulus to practise writing skills including name writing and short words and labels



Our unit 'Me and My Relationships' elps us to establish classroom rules as well as discussing feelings and friendships.



Our maths learning will focus on number and place value, building on our existing understanding of the number system. We will use number lines to secure our understanding of more/less and we will begin to count in 10s.

Geography

We will leam what a 'geographer' is and explore where we fit in the world. We will use google earth to zoom in on the UK and England.





Incredible Me!

Year 1 - Autumn 1

We will be introducing the terms 'pulse' and 'rhythm' through clapping and singing games.



This half term we will be developing personal skills involving coordination through footwork and static balance





<u>Year</u> 1— -Aut<u>umn 2</u>



We will be reading 'Window' and using this to inspire us to design a new garden, including labels and captions.

We will be reading 'Welcome to Alien School' and using this to create a guide to our school. Our focus will be on sentence skills; starting with a capital letter, using spaces between words and ending with a full stop.







Maths

Our maths learning will move on to adding and subtracting, introducing the term 'partitioning'. We will also look at measure, focusing on length and height.



We will explore the 'human features' and 'physical features' during a walk around our local area. We will also compare our surroundings to that of a contrasting school, in Portsmouth.



Computing

We will be looking at technology around us and introducing basic computer skills, using the iPads.

We will focus on safely using tools to develop our joining skills by creating a structure. We will visit a local park for

inspiration before designing and ouilding our own playground structure

Celebrating Learning at Bidbury

Year 2

English

In English, we will be exploring two texts linked to the Titanic. We will be reading 'The Story of Titanic for Children' by Joe Fullman and 'Samson's Titanic Journey' by Lauren Graham. We will be writing diary entries from different points of view as well as creating our own non-fiction texts. We will continue to learn about punctuating our sentences as well as continue to grow our vocabulary knowledge to use in our writing.





We will be starting the year by looking at number and place value and exploring 2 digit numbers. In addition and subtraction we will be comparing numbers within 100. Our final math's journey this half term with be measurement of money.

Maths

cience

We will be learning about animals and their survival needs. We will look at the different animal groups and how they are the same and different. We will take part in hands on experiments, focused on each animal group.



History

We will be jumping on board HMS
Titanic and leaming about how times
have changed in the last 100 years.
We will be looking at the different
experiences of the classes on board the
Titanic and what we have leamt and
changed due to the Titanic sinking and
the significant loss of lives.



Year 2 - Autumn 1



Art — Paul Klee

Autumn - Paul Klee (artist) Collage/painting/sculpture. We will be
learning about the artist Paul Klee and
exploring colour mixing and collage.
Our final outcome will be using water
colours to create a background and a
collage of the Titanic.



Music — British Isles

In music we will be listening to British songs and sounds and re-creating our compositions based on what we've heard.



PSHE — Me and my relationships

We will me exploring ourselves and our relationships. We will be looking at the difference between bullying and teasing, the importance and reason for school rules, how to be a good friend and how to manage our own emotions.

RE — Authority

We are going to be talking about key events in Jesus' life, focusing on his authority. We will talk about who has authority in our lives and why.



PE - Personal

Fundamental Movement Skills Co-ordination – footwork Static balance – one leg

Our Leaming Focus: Personal
We will be leaming how to challenge
ourselves, ask for help and follow
instructions to be safe.
